Paper & Printing Suggestions

This paper mask was designed to work best using smooth, bright white, light weight, card stock. (11x17 Tabloid)

Or just print it out on regular stock and spray mount it to thicker stock before cutting the mask out.

Print **PDF** using Adobe Acrobat or Acrobat Reader for best results. Do not use Apples 'Preview App' to print out the **PDF**, it cannot process all the transparency details and will look bad.

Easy Instructions

Cut Out Perimeter

If you have Jedi Knight Exacto skills you won't need to use scissors.



Cut on the Edge

Cut out the mustache along the edge of the art in this area and under the nose above. Do not include a white halo in these areas otherwise when you put the two piece together they won't look right.

Easy Instructions

Tape/Glue Area
Double back tape is highly recommended to affix the mustache to the beard art. But glue will work too.

Cut Out Perimeter
If you have Jedi Knight Exacto skills you won't need to use scissors.

Just attach your final constructed Twitter Beard to a stick (stir stick) and start living life to it's fullest!
